Medical Social Worker:

We are so excited to announce a kidney transplant took place at Dialysis West; the recipient patient was encouraged to stay on the active transplant list, and she didn't give up. She received her kidney transplant within six years. On average in the state of Arizona, "It takes five to seven years of kidney transplantation, but some patients took only one and a half years." The key to kidney transplantation is keeping up with your dialysis treatment regimen and following through with kidney transplant center orders.

Registered Dietitian:

High phosphorus can cause itchiness, bone pain, hardening of skin/tissues, and makes bones more likely to break. Normal phosphorus levels help keep your bones healthy-take your phosphorus binders and watch out for high-phosphorus foods like dairy, beans, nuts, and cola!

Peritoneal Dialysis Updates

Dialysis treatment has become the HOPE of people afflicted with Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD). Patients have more options now depending on their lifestyles. One option is PERITONEAL DIALYSIS (PD), which uses the lining of the abdomen to filter wastes and remove extra fluid from your body.

Prior to starting a dialysis treatment, your kidney doctor will help you decide what the best treatment for you is. PD is not for everyone.

PROS: Few dietary and fluid restrictions; no needle sticks; more freedom and flexibility on your schedule; PD can be performed at home or in the office.

CONS: Like any other type of dialysis treatment, INFECTION is the most common complication.

If there are any discrepancies in scheduled times, please communicate with Janice to allow for immediate changes and limit wait times for patients.



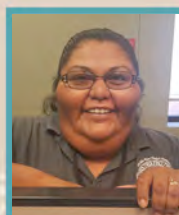
Welcome, New Employees!

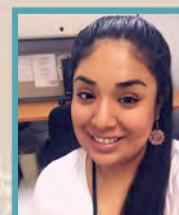
